The rankings, which are classified separately in singles and doubles (for example ITSF & P4P), are also evaluated.

## For players who are listed in several rankings: The Player's highest ranking is evaluated

**Example A:** IFP-Ranking = Rookie, ITSF Ranking = No 125, **P4P = Elite**, European Tornado Ranking 2006 = Expert, TFBÖ (AT) = Pro This means that the highest classification P4P is counted, **the player is classified as a Pro**.

**Example B:** IFP = Rookie, **ITSF = Top 100**, P4P = Amateur, European Tornado Ranking = Amateur, STF SWISS (CH) = Rookie This means that the highest classification ITSF is counted, **the player is classified as an Expert**.

Example C: IFP = Rookie, ITSF = No. 125, P4P = Amateur, BFA (UK) = Novice
This means that the highest classifications ITSF / P4P are counted, the player is classified as an Amateur

There are all national rankings (AT, BE, BG, CH, CZ, DK, FR, LU, NL, PL, SK...) evaluated (April 19, 2013)
